

2017–2018 GRADUATE FELLOWSHIPS IN PEACE STUDIES

Application Deadline: March 8, 2017

The Judith Reppy Institute for Peace and Conflict Studies will award several graduate student fellowships for the 2017–2018 year. The fellowships cover tuition plus a stipend and health insurance for Cornell Ph.D. students whose research explicitly treats issues of security, conflict, or collective violence. Cornell no longer subsidizes the tuition costs of Institute fellows, so our funds can only support students who will be in absentia during the 2017-2018 academic year. When in Ithaca, successful applicants are expected to participate in Reppy Institute activities, including the weekly seminar and any other special events.

The fellowships will support students whose work is relevant to peace and conflict studies. Examples of topics that have been supported in the past include dual-use technology and weapons proliferation; international humanitarian law and the norms of warfare; the impact of new technologies and strategies; regional security; histories of war or peace; studies of ethnic conflict; international political economy related to security; civil-military relations; terrorism; and post-conflict reconciliation and reconstruction.

Reppy Institute fellowship support from external funds is not intended to substitute for Cornell financial support. In order to receive a Reppy Institute fellowship, the Director of Graduate Studies of the student's graduate field must affirm that the Reppy Institute support will not lead to a reduction in the fellow's guaranteed package of support.

To apply for one of the fellowships:

- Complete an online application. You will be asked to provide a thesis title or area of research interest, as well as a short thesis prospectus (include research methods); or a general statement of research interests, if you are not at the dissertation stage.
- Request an official Cornell e-transcript from the Registrar to be sent to pacs@inaudi.cornell.edu by the application deadline.
- Save your online application as you go. Once you submit your application you will still be able to edit your submission up until the deadline date.
- Ask your committee chairperson to write a letter of recommendation. Once you submit your fellowship application online your recommender will be given access to the online system and will receive an automatic email prompting him or her to upload a recommendation letter.

Deadline: March 8, 2017

To summarize, eligibility is limited to students who plan to be in absentia during 2017–2018 conducting research and writing on topics clearly relevant to peace and conflict studies.
